What the children like

- At Stanhope, the teachers incorporate creative ideas into what could be boring work or lessons. Children like learning if they feel involved and they are enjoying what they are doing.
- Lessons and assemblies become easier to understand and more likeable, if children feel enthused by visitors and their activities.
- A point that was mentioned quite a lot was that every child felt safe and secure in school: everyone is friendly! Some members of staff are always on the yard to help children when in need of assistance.
- Everyone feels included in all activities and they get to be a part of a range of different sessions.

Another idea was that everyone is treated equally. People with dyslexia are not excluded from others and their lessons, and they are given the chance to be challenged in the same way as the other children.

In our school, the teachers are patient and understanding and they care about our educations.

We are often challenged because of the teachers' high expectations for every pupil.

There have been a few comments made on how the children enjoy clubs and extra (fun) activities.

What we have learnt from this school

 We have learnt to be: confident independent caring towards others understanding and helpful. KFC (standing for Kindness, Fellowship and Confidence) taught us about how to be friendly and generous individuals.
