- 4) Register with your email address or Facebook
- 5) Click Create my account for free

When you login in you can click on Donation Reminder in the top right hand side of the site. This will put a reminder in to your browser toolbar so that whenever you shop on any of the 4,000 websites that donate to our school when you buy something it will pop up and you can activate your donation with one easy click.

Recycle clothing

Donate any unwanted clothing, shoes and bags in the donation bin outside the staff carpark. We receive a donation based on the weight of clothing they collect.
